The Lord of the Flies






Lord of the flies book focus about a group of British boys stranded on an uninhabited island and their disastrous attempt to govern themselves.







Lord of the Flies, by Sir William Golding, is a classic novel of survival, that shows a terrifying amount of truth about society and the flaws of human nature. Each character and significant object included in the book possess a recognizable symbolic significance of its own.

Ralph

Ralph is the prime representative of leadership, civilization and order; he is the “leader” of the boys from the beginning, and tries to keep everyone else in line. Ralph blows the conch to assemble all the boys together; he suggests to elect a leader by voting, showing his thought of democracy and law.

Piggy

“Piggy”, as the other boys call him, is Ralph’s friend, and has asthma and weak eyesight. Piggy realizes the seriousness of being stranded on the island and suggests ways on how to make their lives more efficient on the island. He was the one who gave Ralph the information on the use of the conch, and he also even thought about creating a sundial so that they can tell time. Piggy sees life in a scientific and rational way, therefore his character representing intellect and rationalism.

Simon

Simon’s character is the symbolism of saintliness, spiritual human goodness and morality, and could be said to be a Jesus-like figure.

Jack

Jack is Ralph’s antagonist, and is the embodiment of evil and the instinct of savagery and violence. The less there are restraints of civilization, the more Jack becomes violent. He reaches out of control to the point where he can no longer distinguish the differences between humans and animals, and orders the hunters to not only kill pigs, but also to kill other people like Simon and Piggy.

The Conch


Piggy's Eyeglasses

Lord of the Flies Book Review-Honey Swe

In Lord of the Flies, William Golding uses a conch, or a large, milky-white shell, to symbolize a civilized society that regulates itself through democratic engagement. Initially, the boys use the conch to establish a society reminiscent of their familiar British social order: a civil society founded on discourse and consensus. Lord of the Flies, another name for the Devil, is a symbol of the beast, which represents evil. The Lord of The Flies was a pig's head that symbolizes the opposite of order and logic, madness, and insanity.

The fire that was started by Ralph using Piggy's glasses meant how in the modern-day society, people have more power than others, and when the fire spread throughout the forest, it meant that became the tyrannical rulers of the island and the littluns were the inferior inhabitants of the island. The conch was a shell that was discovered by Piggy (the most logical character) and was used as a horn to regroup with all the other survivors of the island. It symbolizes order and logic. At the near end of the book, the conch was destroyed and Piggy was killed along with it. When it was destroyed, the boys lost what little logic they had left. Piggy's glasses are symbolic for a number of reasons in Lord of the Flies. The spectacles represent the boys' only means of obtaining fire through reflecting the sun's rays, and fire itself is symbolic of survival and rescue. Later, Jack punches Piggy which cause the glasses to fall, smashing one side.

Piggy – Piggy is Ralph right hand man. Though criticized for his weight, asthma and lack of physical agility, He is the scientific mind and the rational thinker of Ralph's team.

Jack – The antagonist of the novel, and one of the older boys and leader of the choir. Jack becomes increasingly dark and disturbed during his stay on island. He represents the evil that exists within all men in uncivilized situations.

The Lord of the Flies by William Golding is a novel in which the theme of savagery versus civilisation is explored. Some British boys are stranded on an isolated island at the time of an imaginary nuclear war. On the island we see conflict [REDACTED] between two main characters, Jack and Ralph, who respectively represent civilisation and savagery. This has an effect on the rest of the boys throughout the novel as they delve further and further into savagery. [REDACTED]

The theme of savagery versus civilisation is first introduced to us through the symbol of the conch shell which we associate with Ralph as he is the person who first uses it and becomes the elected leader of the boys. This symbolises authority [REDACTED] amongst the boys. At the first assembly Ralph says "I'll give the conch to the next person to speak...he won't be [REDACTED] interrupted". This suggests civilisation as Ralph is allowing each boy to have an equal say and opinion. If they have the conch, no matter who they are or what age they are they will be given the chance to speak and will be listened to by the rest of the boys. The boys have created the island to be a democratic place which shows a civilised side to them as they try to [REDACTED] mimic the homes they have just left. [REDACTED]

Contrasting with the symbol of the conch is the symbol of the beast which comes to be associated with Jack as by the end of the novel he is almost devil worshipping it. The beast begins as a "snake thing" but by the end of the novel it has become "the Lord of the Flies". The first quote shows us that the beast is clearly evil. Western society considers snakes to be bad [REDACTED] omens because it was a snake that led Eve to eat from the tree of knowledge. However at this stage of the novel the beast is quite insubstantial as it is only a "thing". As the boys fear of the beast grows so to does the beast itself until it [REDACTED] has manifested into the devil – the ultimate and most powerful evil. He has a strong status as a Lord although it is over [REDACTED] something pretty disgusting – the flies. The boys belief in the beast leads them to behave more like savages as they act out from their fear and they begin to loose hold of the rules, led by Jack, thus demonstrating the theme of savagery. 

After a while, as they were asleep, they did not notice the flashing lights and explosions in the clouds. This occurs since some military planes were engage in a battle which was above the island. But, since Sam and Eric; they were the twins who were responsible to watch the fire at night are also asleep, so they did not also see the parachutist land like the other boys who were asleep. When they woke up, they see the enormous silhouette of the parachute and at the same time, they also hear strange flapping noises from it. As soon as the boys arrive on the island, he takes off his school uniform, recognizing that it is unsuitable for the hot, tropical weather. He is also pragmatic, showing no hesitation over this symbolic loss of their former lifestyle. In this way, he differs greatly from some of the other boys, who cling to scraps of their former lives. His immediate instinct is to organize the boys by setting up a system of government. He is careful to wait for democratic approval before assuming the role of Chief, and his orders are sensible and practical: build shelters, start a signal fire, and set up a system to ensure the fire doesn't go out. Ralph isn't perfect, however. In the end, he survives not because of his orderly authority but rather through his ultimate embrace of his animal instinct as he runs through the jungle. He owns a conch to call the other children anytime.

Piggy

Piggy, the second character we meet in the novel, is a chubby, ungainly boy with a history of being bullied. Piggy is not very physically capable, but he is well-read and intelligent, and he frequently offers excellent suggestions and ideas. He wears glasses. Piggy immediately allies himself with Ralph and remains his steadfast ally throughout their adventure. However, Piggy's loyalty stems more from his awareness that he is powerless on his own than from true friendship. It is only through Ralph that Piggy has any authority or agency, and as Ralph's grip on the other boys diminishes, Piggy's does too. It's notable that Piggy emerges shortly after Ralph on the beach, as science and knowledge require a civilizing force before they can come into fruition. Piggy's value is represented by his glasses, which the boys utilize as a scientific instrument to create fire. When Piggy loses possession and control of the glasses, he becomes less capable physically and the glasses become a magical totem instead of a scientific tool.

Jack

Jack is Ralph's rival for authority on the island. Described as unattractive and aggressive, Jack believes he should be the Chief, and he resents Ralph's easy authority and popularity. He is quickly presented as Ralph and Piggy's enemy, and he begins undermining their authority from the moment they attain it. Of all the boys, Jack is the least bothered by the experience of being stranded on a deserted island. He seems fairly happy to be free to do as he likes, and he hates the way Ralph attempts to limit this newfound freedom with rules. Jack seeks to regain his ultimate freedom throughout the novel. While he initially seems to represent fascism and authority-worship, Jack actually represents anarchy. He rejects any limitations on his personal desires, including the desire to inflict harm on and eventually kill others. He is the opposite of Ralph, and from the very beginning of the novel, it is clear they cannot co-exist in a single society.

Simon

Simon is shy and timid, but has a strong moral compass and sense of self. He behaves according to his inner sense of right and wrong, even as the other boys become increasingly violent and chaotic. In fact, Simon is the only boy who does not engage in any sort of violence. He has a prophetic hallucination in which he speaks to the Lord of the Flies; afterwards, he discovers that the feared Beast does not exist. He rushes to share this information with the other boys, who panic at the sound of Simon's frenzy and kill him.

Roger

Roger is Jack's second-in-command, and he is arguably more cruel and savage than Jack. While Jack enjoys power and the title of Chief, Roger disdains authority and has a single-minded desire to hurt and destroy. He represents true savagery. At first, he is held back from his worst desires by just one memory of civilization: the fear of punishment. When he realizes that no punishment will come, he transforms into an elemental force of evil. Roger is the boy who ultimately kills Piggy, destroying sense and wisdom in favor of raw violence.

Sam and Eric (Samneric)

Sam and Eric are a pair of twins, referred to collectively by the name Samneric. Samneric are steadfast followers of Ralph until the very end of the novel, when they are captured and forcibly inducted into Jack's tribe. The twins, who cling to the old ways of civilization, are representative of the majority of humankind. They represent the faceless populations that make up large societies, particularly in the eyes of governments. Samneric do not have much agency in the story, and they are dominated by forces around them. Their transition to Jack's tribe represents the final fall of civilization.

Lord of the Flies Reflections

Ralph and Jack grew to be rivals as time passed, leading them and the other boys to lose their senses.

Ralph asked the group to make a signal fire, hoping that a passing ship would see the smoke signal and rescue them. However, Jack commanded the group of boys to sacrifice the responsibility of keeping the fire in order to engage in hunting. Because of their natural attraction to and inclination towards adventurous hunting activities, which signify violence and evil, Jack progressively drags the other boys away from Ralph's influence.

The boys' literal terror of a mythical beast roaming the island intensifies the tension between Jack and Ralph — and the forces of civilization and savagery that they reflect. Jack's hunters attacked them and their few followers, and stole Piggy's glasses in the process. Ralph's team traveled to Jack's base in the hopes of persuading him to see reason, but Jack had Sam and Eric restrained and attacked Ralph. One of the boys, Roger, rolled a boulder down the mountain, killing Piggy and shattering the conch shell in the attempt. Ralph barely made it through a shower of spears.


To get Ralph out of his hiding location, Jack has the other guys set fire to the woodland. Ralph went into hiding for the rest of the night and the next day, while the others hunted him down like an animal. He was eventually dragged onto the beach, where he was confronted by a British naval officer. He overcame with relief and joy at the fact that he was safe, but he broke down in tears as he realized what had happened.

Ralph was a wise leader who was concerned about the children's safety. The conch, as his object, was a seashell-like accessory that could be blown into. When compared to our civilization, where the conch is our president and the people are the guys who came together, the conch speaks of peace. Piggy was a clumsy but an obedient kid who spent the entire time following Ralph around. The signal fire was initiated by the lenses in his eyeglasses, and the eyeglasses reflect about power in the present era. Ralph is the oldest among the boys. He is kind, good-looking, and a pretty good leader in charge. He is organized, responsible, and makes good decisions at the same time.


His conch is used as a tool to call the boys if there is a meeting and the person who is holding it would be given a chance to speak.



Ralph's election angers Jack, a fellow schoolchild who wants to be in charge. We also meet a third boy, Simon—a dreamy, almost spiritual character. The boys organize into separate tribes, choosing Ralph or Jack as their leader.

Jack announces that he will organize a hunting party. He attracts more boys to his tribe as they hunt the wild pigs. A rumor begins of a beast in the forest. Jack and his second-in-command Roger announce they will kill the beast. Terror drives the other boys away from Ralph's orderly tribe into Jack's group, which becomes increasingly savage. Simon has a vision of the Lord of the Flies, then discovers a pilot's body in the trees, which he realizes the boys have mistaken for a beast. Simon races to the beach to tell the other boys that the beast was an illusion, but the boys mistake Simon for the beast and kill him.

After all the boys' defect to Jack's tribe, Ralph and Piggy make one last stand. Piggy is killed by Roger. Ralph flees and arrives on the beach just as a ship has arrived on the island. The captain expresses horror at what the boys have become. The boys suddenly stop and burst into tears.

Lord of the Flies

The book Lord of the flies by William Golding is about this group of school boys whose plane gets shot out while they are escaping the atomic war going on around them. The people that realized what they had done were very dear to Simon, but they fell upon the chanting mob of the enemy tribe which allowed them to go savage, murderous, tribalistic, and satanic to their own friend Simon. The reason why these horrific acts happen is because of the lack of enforcing and making laws, the reason why we have a government is to keep the bad from entering our bodies or to limit the amount of cruelty of the human mind. Because of sin, the human mind normally focuses on what is wrong and what is right, but normally man falls for what is wrong and they do this either to get an easier outcome or to hurt the feelings of the other. LORD of the Files

The Lord of the Flies by William Golding is a novel in which the theme of savagery versus civilisation is explored. Some British boys are stranded on an isolated island at the time of an imaginary nuclear war. On the island we see conflict between two main characters, Jack and Ralph, who respectively represent civilisation and savagery. This has an effect on the rest of the boys throughout the novel as they delve further and further into savagery. There are three main characters Ralph, Piggy, and Jack. Ralph is the president of the boys. We can see the conflict between savagery and civilisation developing further when Piggy's glasses are broken. We are told "Piggy cried out in terror 'my specs!'" 

Notably, Ralph's right-hand man, Piggy, is the deuterogamist, representing the intellectual, wise side of humanity. Jack is the arrogant, power-hungry antagonist who represents the evil, savage, selfish side of humanity. All of the main characters are presented in unique ways, with everyone playing an important role throughout the plot. Characterization sets the tone of the novel by Golding giving each individual their own qualities and roles, which becomes crucial in various situations where certain people can make, Jack gathers a group of boys for a hunting expedition, which takes them away from the job of maintaining the signal fire. The fire goes out. Shortly after, a boat moves past the island but does not spot the boys thanks to the lack of fire. 




Lord of the flies speak for variety of categories such as survival, hope and agony. In the course of a certain war, a group of students, who all seems to be boys to be exact, encounter a deserted tropical island by a plane. As a result, the boys had to work harmoniously as a team in order to survive. Ralph blows the conch shells, which signals the boys for gathering. From my point of view, the conch shell [REDACTED] symbolizes command and civilization, notifying the boys it's time to gather. Piggy's glasses resemble intelligence and logic, Ralph started a fire using the glasses, to attract the attention of passing [REDACTED] ships, signifying desperate need of help. When the glasses fall in the hands of Jack, disaster occurs, causing the civilization to collapse. Ralph, the island's oldest and biggest boy, is 12 years old. After a choir led by a child named Jack emerges from the jungle, the boys decide to vote for a chief, and they uniformly choose Ralph. However, Jack is not pleased with the fact that he has been demoted. He is, in reality, humiliated. Ralph likes him and wants to be friends with him, so he tells Jackson that he is in command of the choir and that the choir will be hunting. Ralph takes Simon and Jack to the peak of the mountain, where they discover that they have landed on an island. When they conduct meetings, he makes it a rule that whoever has the conch gets to speak first. Then they spend several days on the island hunting in order to survive. The choir splits into two sections after a fight between Jack and Ralph. One day, Jack sets fire to the entire island, and Ralph rushes out to the beach, where a British naval officer has just arrived to investigate the smoke. Ralph tries to explain what occurred to the officer and begins to cry, as do the other boys.

Lord of the flies



Lord of the Files



Lord of the Files is William Golding's 1954 novel about a group of young boys who find themselves alone on a deserted island with Ralph, Piggy and Jack being the main characters. They make rules and develop a system of organization but without an adult, things go sideways and the children become more violent.

Ralph, the protagonist of Lord of the Files comes from a middle class family and leads the group. He lives by rules, act peacefully and is a moral character. He wants a civilized place for all the boys on the island. He also suggested that the boys make chief by voting and Ralph becomes chief. Although he is well collected and keeps the boys together his intelligence is crippled by fear. I think he represents civilization and democracy.

LORD OF THE FLIES BOOK REVIEW

Lord of the Flies is a fascinating tussle story about savagery and survival. It is an extremely gripping story about a group of young boys who are plane-wrecked and stranded on a deserted island for a long period of time, lose their civilized side and turn barbaric. How do they survive? Who leads them? Why do they turn into savage animals who feed each other's blood? The answers are all in the book. Overseeing their efforts are Ralph, "the boy with fair hair," and Piggy, Ralph's chubby, wisdom-dispensing sidekick whose which spectacles come in handy for lighting fires. Although Ralph tries to impose order and delegate responsibility, there are many in their number who would rather swim, play or hunt the island's wild pig population. Soon Ralph's rules are being ignored or challenged outright. His fiercest antagonist is Jack, the redheaded leader of the pig hunters, who manages to lure away many of the boys to join his band of painted savages. The situation deteriorates as the trappings of civilization continue to fall away, until Ralph discovers that instead of being hunters, he and Piggy have become the hunted. Their quest for more power, food and freedom causes them to gradually become brutes. This also leads to the loss of their friendship and trust among them. Their primitive behavior even results in the gruesome deaths of two boys.

The courage, grit and determination shown by the young minds to survive against all odds, left me awe-struck. The hunger for survival gave strength to the children to think in a way no other kids could even imagine. The only thing that disappointed me in this book was the abrupt ending that the book has. Ralph bumping into a naval officer out of nowhere didn't go well for me. I would have liked the author to show the kids doing something constructive on their own to fight out this adversity.

The Lord of the Flies by William Golding is a novel in which the theme of savagery versus civilization is explored. Some British boys are stranded on an isolated island at the time of an imaginary nuclear war. On the island we see conflict between two main characters, Jack and Ralph, who respectively represent civilization and savagery. This influences the rest of the boys throughout the novel as they delve further and further into savagery.

The theme of savagery versus civilization is first introduced to us through the symbol of the conch shell which we associate with Ralph as he is the person who first uses it and becomes the elected leader of the boys. This symbolizes authority amongst the boys. At the first assembly Ralph says "I'll give the conch to the next person to speak...he won't be interrupted". This suggests civilization as Ralph is allowing each boy to have an equal say and opinion. If they have the conch, no matter who they are or what age they are they will be given the chance to speak and will be listened to by the rest of the boys. The boys have created the island to be a democratic place which shows a civilized side to them as they try to mimic the homes they have just left.

Contrasting with the symbol of the conch is the symbol of the beast which comes to be associated with Jack as by the end of the novel he is almost devil worshipping it. The beast begins as a "snake thing" but by the end of the novel it has become "the Lord of the Flies". The first quote shows us that the beast is clearly evil. Western society considers snakes to be bad omens because it was a snake that led Eve to eat from the tree of knowledge. However, at this stage of the novel the beast is quite insubstantial as it is only a "thing". As the boys' fear of the beast grows so too does the beast itself until it has manifested into the devil – the ultimate and most powerful evil. He has a strong status as a Lord although it is over something pretty disgusting – the flies. The boy's belief in the beast leads them to behave more like savages as they act out from their fear and they begin to lose hold of the rules, led by Jack, thus demonstrating the theme of savagery.

One of ways Golding shows conflict between savagery and civilization is when Jack and some of the other boys are killing the first pig. Jack chants "kill the pig, cut her throat, spill the blood". This suggests savagery as the boys are being violent and aggressive when killing the pig and they don't care about it. This is particularly clear through Golding's word choice. Jack talks about cutting the pig's throat which makes it sound like a savage action and spilling her blood which reinforces the lack of care and feeling shown towards the pig's carcass. This shows that the boys are no longer feeling guilty about what they have done thus showing them becoming savages.


We can see the conflict between savagery and civilization developing further when Piggy's glasses are broken. We are told "Piggy cried out in terror 'my specs!'" This shows us that the boys savage natures are beginning to overrule their more civilized sides. At the start of the book Jack would never have dared touch Piggy, but here he actually snaps and goes for Piggy who he despises. We can tell that Piggy is really scared as Golding chooses the words "cried" and "terror" to describe the scene. Piggy sounds like he is hurting and is genuinely terrified about what Jack might do to him and the loss of his sight. Piggy's glasses have also come to represent intelligence on the island, with them breaking we see that the pathway to savagery is now completely open for the boys. This is the first true piece of violence between the two factions on the island and it will result in nearly all the boy's becoming savages.

A final way in which we see the theme of savagery versus civilization being demonstrated is when Ralph sticks up for Piggy after he is attacked by Jack. Ralph says "that was a dirty trick". This shows that Ralph is really angry at Jack for what he said and did to Piggy. He is still attempting to impose himself as leader here as he says this in an aggressive and assertive tone. This suggests there is still some glimmers of civilization on the island at this point as there is still someone with a sense of moral goodness ready to fight for justice.

In conclusion The Lord of the Flies by William Golding is a novel in which the theme of savagery versus civilization is shown. Ralph represents civilization as he wants to enforce rules and let everyone have an equal say. Whereas Jack who represents savagery as he rules over the boys and he is not interested in what they have to say. Through the boy's actions Golding shows us that we need rules and to consciously impose them to make sure society functions properly.

Amid of a raging war, a plane evacuating a group of schoolchildren from Britain is shot down over a deserted tropical island. Two of the boys, Ralph, and Piggy, discover a conch shell on the beach, and Piggy realizes it could be used as a horn to summon the other boys. Once assembled, the boys set about electing a leader and devising a way to be rescued. They choose Ralph as their leader, and Ralph appoints another boy, Jack, to oversee the boys who will hunt food for the entire group.

Ralph, Jack, and another boy, Simon, set off on an expedition to explore the island. When they return, Ralph declares that they must light a signal fire to attract the attention of passing ships. The boys succeed in igniting some dead wood by focusing sunlight through the lenses of Piggy's eyeglasses. However, the boys pay more attention to playing than to monitoring the fire, and the flames quickly engulf the forest. A large swath of dead wood burns out of control, and one of the youngest boys in the group disappears, having burned to death. I would like to recommended this book to anyone who likes to read adventure and all and would be a great collection to your summer reading bucket list!
