Stanley Yelnats is a teenage boy from a poor family, whose future fortune depends on his inventor father discovering the secret to curing bad foot odor. Stanley's great-great-grandfather did not honor a promise he made to an old woman with magical powers, and misfortune has followed him and his descendants ever since. Stanley was sent to Camp Green Lake for being accused of stealing baseball star Clyde "Sweet Feet" Livingston's shoes. Stanley was assigned to Tent D by Mr. Pendanski the camp supervisor. He befriends his tent mates and slowly learns the ropes of surviving in the harsh conditions of the camp. He becomes particularly good friends with a small but tough boy named Zero. Stanley and the other boys are forced to dig a hole every day, five feet deep and five feet wide. The boys are told that the digging will teach them to work hard. In Camp Green Lake, Stanley begins to teach Zero how to read. Zero eventually runs away from the camp, and a couple of days later Stanley steals the water truck to followed him. Stanley finds Zero under an overturned and abandoned boat eating the decades-old leftovers of the peaches that woman named Katherine Barlow loved to make. Zero is the descendant of Madame Zeroni. They have the chance to put things right and break the curse that Madame Zeroni make. It was by forgetting this promise that he brought the curse down on him and his descendants. Stanley and Zero find themselves at the mountain that Stanley spotted from afar. Zero becomes too weak to continue, so Stanley carries him up. After coming down, the two friends go back to Camp Green Lake and find the treasure. They were nearly caught and kill by the supervisors. Stanley and Zero split the treasure, and Zero uses his half to find his mother. Stanley's father is finally able to find, patent, and sell a cure for foot odor.

Today I am going to talk about the book. The name of the book was to kill a mockingbird. *To Kill a Mockingbird* takes place in the fictional town of Maycomb, Alabama, during the Great Depression. The protagonist is Jean Louise ("Scout") Finch, an intelligent though unconventional girl who ages from six to nine years old during the course of the novel. She is raised with her brother, Jeremy Atticus ("Jem"), by their widowed father, Atticus Finch. He is a prominent lawyer who encourages his children to be empathetic and just. He notably tells them that it is "a sin to kill a mockingbird," alluding to the fact that the birds are innocent and harmless.

When Tom Robinson, one of the town's Black residents, is falsely accused of raping Mayella Ewell, a white woman, Atticus agrees to defend him despite threats from the community. At one point he faces a mob intent on lynching his client but refuses to abandon him. Scout unwittingly diffuses the situation. Although Atticus presents a defense that gives a more plausible interpretation of the evidence—that Mayella was attacked by her father, Bob Ewell—Tom is convicted, and he is later killed while trying to escape custody. A character compares his death to "the senseless slaughter of songbirds."

The children, meanwhile, play out their own miniaturized drama of prejudice and superstition as they become interested in Arthur ("Boo") Radley, a reclusive neighbor who is a local legend. They have their own ideas about him and cannot resist the allure of trespassing on the Radley property. Their speculations thrive on the dehumanization perpetuated by their elders. Atticus, however, reprimands them and tries to encourage a more sensitive attitude. Boo makes his presence felt indirectly through a series of benevolent acts, finally intervening when Bob Ewell attacks Jem and Scout. Boo kills Ewell, but Heck Tate, the sheriff, believes it is better to say that Ewell's death occurred when he fell on his own knife, sparing the shy Boo from unwanted attention. Scout agrees, noting that to do otherwise would be "sort of like shooting' a mockingbird."

To Kill a Mockingbird is both a young girl's coming-of-age story and a darker drama about the roots and consequences of racism and prejudice, probing how good and evil can coexist within a single community or individual. Scout's moral education is twofold: to resist abusing others with unfounded negativity but also to persevere when these values are inevitably, and sometimes violently, subverted. Lee reportedly based the character of Atticus Finch on her father, Amasa Coleman Lee, a compassionate and dedicated lawyer. The plot of *To Kill a Mockingbird* was inspired in part by his unsuccessful youthful defense of two African American men convicted of murder. Criticism of the novel's tendency to sermonize has been matched by praise of its insight and stylistic effectiveness.

One character from the novel, Charles Baker ("Dill") Harris, is based on Truman Capote, Lee's childhood friend and next-door neighbors in Monroeville, Alabama. After the phenomenal success that followed the publication of *To Kill a Mockingbird*, some suspected that Capote was the actual author of Lee's work, a rumor put to rest when, in 2006, a 1959 letter from Capote to his aunt was found, stating that he had read and liked the draft of *To Kill a Mockingbird* that Lee had shown him but making no mention of any role in writing it.

The novel inspired numerous adaptations, the most notable of which was the classic 1962 film starring Gregory Peck as Atticus. His Academy Award-winning performance became an enduring part of cinema history. Other adaptations included a Broadway play that was adapted by Aaron Sorkin and debuted in 2018.

Atticus is assigned by Judge Taylor to defend Tom Robinson, a black man accused of raping a young white woman, Mayella Ewell. Although many of the people of Maycomb disapprove, Atticus decides to protect Tom to the best of his ability. Other kids ridicule Jem and Scout because of the actions of Atticus, calling him a "nigger-lover" Scout is tempted, even though he ordered her not to stand up for her father's honor by fighting. Atticus meets a group of men one night, bent on lynching Tom. In an unforeseen way, this crisis is averted: Scout, Jem, and Dill turn up, and Scout unwittingly breaks the mob mentality by noticing and talking to the father of a classmate and dispersing the would-be lynchers.

Atticus does not want the participation of Jem and Scout at the trial of Tom Robinson. The seat on the main floor is not open, but Rev. Sykes invites Jem, Scout, and Dill to watch from the colored balcony. Atticus establishes that they are lying to Mayella and Bob Ewell. It is seen that Mayella made sexual advances towards Tom, resulting in her being beaten by her father afterwards. The townspeople refer to the Ewells as "white trash" who are not to be trusted, but Tom is individually convicted by the jury. The trust of Jem in justice is badly shaken. Atticus is hopeful he can reverse the decision, but while attempting to escape from prison, Tom is shot and killed. "Bob Ewell is embarrassed by the events of the trial despite Tom's conviction, Atticus explaining that he "destroyed [Ewell's] last shred of integrity at that trial." Ewell vows vengeance, spitting in the face of Atticus, attempting to break into the house of the judge and threatening the widow of Tom Robinson. Finally, as they are walking home on a night after the school Halloween pageant, he attacks Jem and Scout.

In the battle, Jem suffers from a broken arm, but in the middle of the chaos, someone comes to the rescue of the children. Jem is carried home by that mysterious man, where Scout discovers that he is Boo Radley. Sheriff Tate comes and finds Ewell dead from the wound of a knife. Atticus thinks Jem was accountable, but Tate is sure it was Boo. The sheriff determines that to preserve the privacy of Boo, he will announce that during the assault, Ewell fell on his knife. Boo asks Scout to get him to walk alone. He disappears after she says goodbye to him at his front door, never to be seen by Scout again. Scout imagines life from the viewpoint of Boo while standing on the Radley porch.

I really enjoy the book and it was very exciting and wonderful. I would highly recommend it to you and hope you like this.



Getting into college is already hard, but being forced into the streets and alone after the hardships in your life, instead of a fulfilling future, was one of the reasons why the public wasn't able to control themselves any longer.

"Summer had come!"

This is a slight glimpse of hope for the narrator, who reassures themselves that when the movement is over, happiness and fulfillment will wait for them in the summer.

"Truly, this world needs to be demolished,
My fellow, fellow, fellow comrades.
Shoot the red possessed by illusion!
You have no place anymore, neither out there nor inside"

The last lyrics I'm going to comment on. The narrator finally commits, and the finale of the movement is in full swing. They claims that the old order, the old world, will be demolished to their comrades, and motivates them to shoot the red one final time, to finally rid of the ones tainted by illusion, the influence of the communist to the high class. At last, the narrator speaks to the fallen, saying that they have lost their places, and that it's all over for them. After that, only vocalization was left, and the song ends, in a reformed Japan after the movement.

I think that this song is a very serious insight on the tragedy known as the Red Purge. We should take an example from this to never see such dramatic history no more. For now, it's now in the past, and let's keep it like that.
